- Ensuring that all employees are competent to do their tasks, and to give them adequate instruction, information, training and supervision and strive to continually improve on such areas;
 - Providing adequate controls to the Health and Safety risks arising from our work activities and ensure that Health and Safety matters are never compromised.
 - Providing and maintaining safe plant, equipment and facilities.
 - Ensuring that all substances are used and handled safely.
 - Preventing injury, cases of work-related ill health, damage and wastage.
 - Consulting between management and employees via the committee on matters affecting their health and safety.
 - Reviewing and where necessary, revising this policy annually.
 - Providing a framework for setting the Health and Safety Objectives.
 - Committing to eliminate hazards and reduce Health and Safety risks.

The Health & Safety Director has delegated responsibility for standards of health and safety throughout the organisation. The Directors are responsible for the effective implementation of the Policy and are supported in this task by the Health and Safety Manager.

Taylor and Fraser comply with all relevant legislation and codes of practice and communicate with relevant enforcing authorities, placing the importance of Health and Safety first at all times.


